Livability

The Rock Creek East II Livability Study will identify opportunities for safer travel for residents and visitors to the neighborhoods of Petworth, Crestwood, Brightwood Park, and 16th Street Heights.

WHAT IS Livability?

Livability is a term that refers to community quality of life as experienced by the people who live, work, and recreate there. DDOT will work with community members and key stakeholders of the Rock Creek East neighborhoods to identify specific opportunities to improve walking, biking, accessing the bus, driving, and servicing daily neighborhood needs. At the end of the study, DDOT will provide recommendations such as:

- Enhanced pedestrian crossings
- More accessible bus stops
- Intersection safety
- Increased green spaces
- Attractive streetscapes
- Signage for better driver information
- Updates to traffic signal times
- Speed controls in sensitive areas
